

Our Mission: To provide Marquette's ski community a chance to work together for the betterment of trails and facilities and to help provide and support youth and adult skiing in the area.



## **Blueberry Ridge Warming Hut Update**

The plans to build the warming hut at Blueberry Ridge Lighted Loop (south parking lot) are off to a good start. As many of our membership are aware, the Superiorland Ski Club is partnering with the DNR and Sands Township to accomplish this long awaited goal. Ongoing support from our community, state, and township is making this effort a dream come true!

Board members Pam Fjeldheim and Debby Muskovitch would like to acknowledge and express gratitude to Cliffs Natural Resources Foundation for providing the Blueberry Ridge Warming Hut Project with a \$40,000 grant. With this donation and with donations from many individuals, service organizations, and businesses we have received over \$62,000 in cash pledges and cash donations! Now our fundraising goal of \$200,000 is well within our reach, and we are hopeful in being able to break ground in spring 2013. A huge thank you is in order to all who have already contributed.

Working together with the community and area businesses, we can make this building happen. Please consider donating toward this endeavor. The Blueberry Ridge Warming Hut will not only warm fingers and toes but will warm the hearts of the Marquette area community and its visitors for many generations!



The Blueberry Ridge Warming Hut is modeled after skiing facilities in our area: the Valley Spur building in Munising and the Nara Chalet in Houghton on Michigan Tech Trails. Our warming hut will promote universal design and green features.

Of final note, the DNR has made some nice changes and improvements at Blueberry which include expanding the south lighted loop parking lot, improving signage at both the crossroads north and south parking lots, and new vault toilets! We are very appreciative of these new and improved updates. The DNR has designated Blueberry as a park which will require a \$10 Recreation Passport this year. The Recreation Passport can be obtained by checking the renewal box on your vehicle license registration or by going to the Marquette DNR office. The Recreation Passport admits you to all Michigan State Parks and Recreation Areas and is quite a deal for only \$10. The fee pipes at Blueberry will still be present to accept donations which will go directly to Blueberry trail maintenance and grooming support. Please continue to support Blueberry!

# 2012 Lake Superior Shore Run

The cool, rainy first day of fall didn't dampen the enthusiasm of runners at the 18th annual Lake Superior Shore Run. 333 people registered for the half marathon, 5k and 1k kids' races, which benefited the Superiorland Ski Club youth programs. The half marathon course, which included a new race section, was fun but challenging according to racers. "I've been around this event for the last 10 years and this year tops them all," said Dan Dehlin. "Packet pick-up was quick and easy. The race course was incredibly well marked. The aid station crews were great. The results were quick and the awards ceremony was fast and efficient."

Kjell-Christian Markset from Marquette, who took second last year, won the half marathon in 1:19:05. Daniel Dehlin from Marquette took second place in 1:21:34, and Kyle Bratrud from Eden Prairie, Minnesota ran the course in 1:22:32, taking third place. Marquette runner Lindsey Dehlin defended her 2011 title by coming back for a second victory on the half marathon course, finishing in 1:45:03. The second and third place winners were close, with Liz Dirkse and Gala Malherbe five seconds apart to claim their podium spots, finishing in 1:49:20 and 1:49:25, respectively.

In the 5k men's race Evan Fezatt of Negaunee claimed the top spot, coming in at 17:51. Blake Murray from Marquette took second in 18:00, with Joey Graci close behind in 18:26 for third place. Mary Kate Cirelli from Marquette won the 5k women's division in 18:00. She was followed by Jordyn Ross in 18:48 and Elizabeth Simak in 19:05 for second and third places.

# **High School Team Training**

The defending State Champion MSHS race team had another good summer of solid dryland training. Workouts included running, rollerskiing, bounding and plyometrics. We were lucky to have three departing seniors help us out this year. They included: four years straight State Champion Ellen Wiitala, Superiorland ski team legend Mike Mcfadden, and current Gustavus Adolphus team skier Eric Wagner. With many of our current team being seniors this year I recently asked Eric Wagner about his transition from high school to college level skiing.

# Training Hard Pays Of

"Up, up, up!!! C'mon let's go!" Anyone who has rollerskied up County Road 99 by St. Peter, Minnesota knows that southern Minnesota is not just flat cornfields. A long road snaking up the valley, 99 is a favorite of our coach's for long intervals or a time trial. In addition, it is often a gateway to other roads, meaning it is usually part of longer distance workouts. Such rigorous and intense training may be too much for some college freshmen; however, I have been able to handle most of it. What has prepared me for this onslaught? In my opinion, my greatest preparation came from the training I did as part of the Superiorland Nordic Race Team.

Specifics aside, much of the training I do with the Gustavus Nordic Ski Team is similar to the training I have done with Superiorland. Though the hills may be steeper, the times faster, and the workouts longer, much of what I have been doing in college seems familiar. The hill bounding, rollerski specific strength, and intervals I have known from training with Superiorland are used in college ski training also. The coaches and team of Superiorland have helped lift me up to my current level of fitness, and have helped prepare me for the difficulty of collegiate skiing.

Transitioning to a college varsity level of training has been, by no means, an easy task. I've had my fair share of getting dropped off the pace, working way too hard on what is supposed to be an easy run, and sometimes just not feeling fit enough. Thanks to the support and preparation of both Superiorland and Gustavus however, I feel confident in my ability to compete at the college level. I believe the preparation I received as part of Superiorland has contributed to my past success, and feel it will be a factor in my future successes as well.


